CORKY SIEGEL APPEARS ON NATIONAL RADIO AND TELEVISION

The freshly innovative sounds of Corky Siegel's Chamber Blues are the feature of nation radio and television programs of late. These broadcasts include:

> In February 2006, Corky Siegel will be featured guest on the popular "Wait, Wait, Don't Tell Me!" National Public Radio comedy quiz program broadcast nationally from coast to coast on February 16, 2006. Corky is also featured on PBS-TV in interviews and performance on the hour long Chicago Blues documentary "Buried Alive in the Blues". In Canada, Corky Siegel's Chamber Blues recetly recorded a live radio performance to be aired nationally in Canada on the CBC that will be heard from coast to coast in the spring. Corky also appeared on the entertainment news for the CBC - aired nationally, and yesterday, he was featured on the popular CKUA radio station broadcast regionally throughout Alberta, Canada.

> Broadcast from New York City in October 2005, host John Platt of New York City's favorite public radio station WFUV 90.7 FM, spent two hours with Corky and the ideas and sounds behind Chamber Blues.
