### **LOS FOLKLORISTAS FEATURED ON LATINO USA RADIO**

Founded in 1966, "Los Folkloristas" have been compared to legendary groups like Inti-Illimani and The Chieftans. This amazing collection of musicians performs on up to 100 different instruments from pre-Columbian ocarinas and triple flutes to contemporary guitars, violins, and percussion. Their music has been heard in sound tracks to the award-winning films, "El Norte" and "Mi Familia—My Family," and on more than 35 recordings they have released world-wide over their career.

The group celebrates their 40th anniversary in 2006 with two North American tours in the Southwest/South Central in April/May 2006 and again for a national tour in Fall 2006.

Launched in 1993, Latino USA is the only national, English-language radio program produced from a Latino perspective. It is a production partnership of KUT Radio and the Center for Mexican American Studies at The University of Texas at Austin.
